**SECTION 4 FIRST AID MEASURES**

**4.1 Description of first aid measures**

##### **IMMEDIATE SYMPTOMS AND HEALTH EFFECTS**

**Skin:** High-Pressure Equipment Information: Accidental high-velocity injection under the skin of materials of this type may result in serious injury.
